Weather – Albuquerque is blessed with about 300 days of sunshine per year. But the first thing you need to know is that in early March, it will probably be in the mid to upper 50s to mid 60s during the day (when sunny) and upper 20s to mid-30s at night. If it is cloudy, the temperature will only get into the 40s during the day. It is also the windy season (when Arizona tries to move to Texas through the air), so don't be surprised. If we have showers or a storm comes through, you might get a chance to see "raining mud!"

Clothing – It is always best to pack with layers for Albuquerque weather.

Rental Cars – Albuquerque is a big, sprawling city. Although not absolutely necessary, if you have one, it greatly expands your ability for good eats!

Santa Fe – The New Mexico state capitol is an easy 70 mile drive (75 mph speed limit) north of Albuquerque along I-25. If you have the time, it is a nice drive, giving you a feel of the expansiveness of the West. The Plaza is the center of tourism with the Cathedral worth seeing. For New Mexican food, try La Choza, 905 Alarid, Santa Fe, NM 87505 – (505) 982-0909.

Casinos – New Mexico is home to several (19) Pueblo tribes, a number of them in the Albuquerque area. The local Pueblos run casinos that are within easy drives:

- Sandia Resort and Casino – North on I-25 (about 11 miles) at Rt. 556 (Tramway Blvd.)
- Isleta Resort & Casino – South on I-25 (about 11 miles) at Rt. 47 South (Broadway Blvd.)
- Santa Ana Star Casino – North on I-25 (about 20 miles) at US-550 (exit 242) North, west of Bernalillo

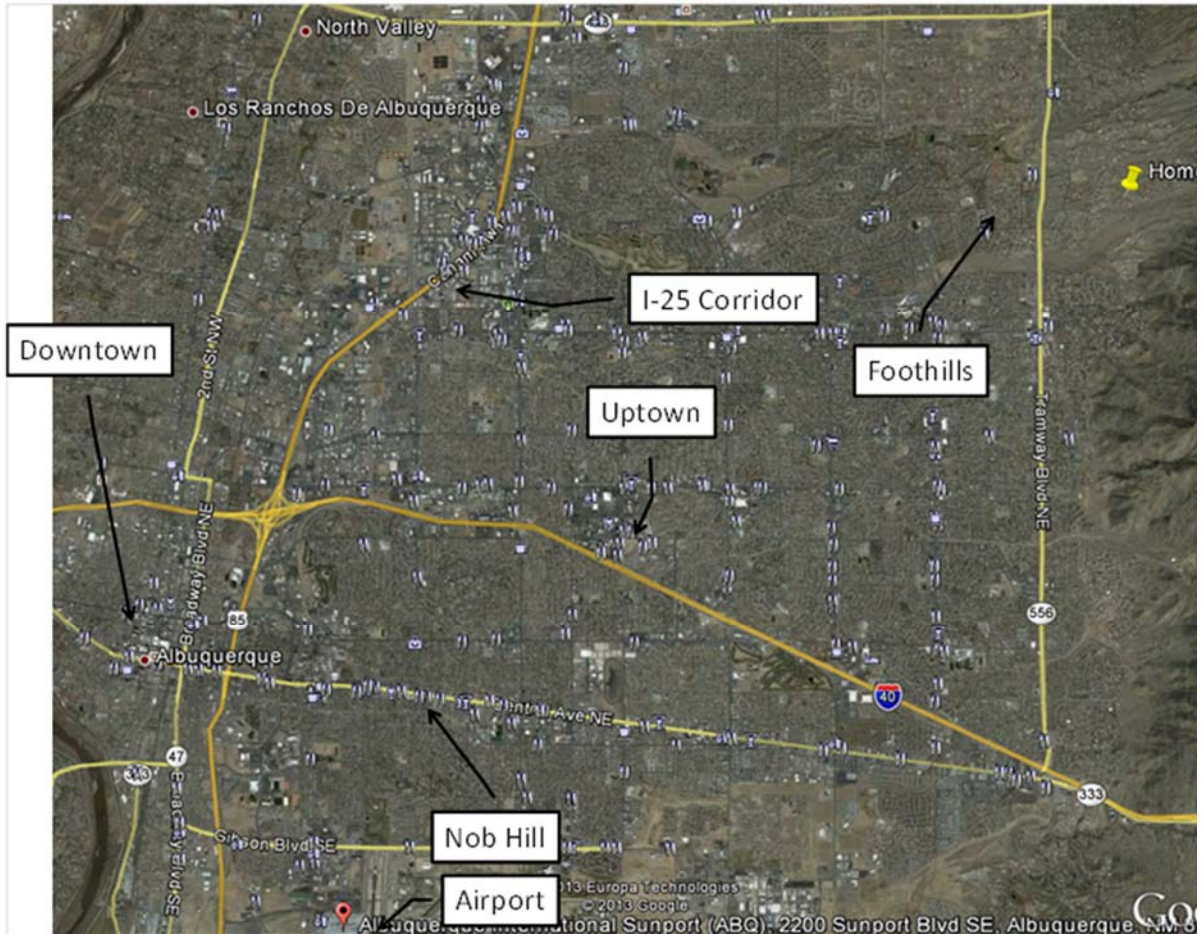

Restaurants

We've organized these into areas across the city, noting ones that are our favorites.

Food and Chile – Albuquerque has LOTS of great restaurants. Don't be confused by the term "New Mexican" – it is unique, it is not Tex-Mex, it is not California-Mex, it is a blend of three cultures: Spanish, Pueblo Indian, and Anglo. New Mexico also has an official State Question: "red or green?" which refers to what kind of chile (yes, that is the correct spelling) you want on your meal. A unique, often used answer is "Christmas" meaning both types. Despite many telling you that red or green are hotter, that really depends on the restaurant, chef, and the season (chile varies). **WARNING:** if you order a bowl of chile, it is probably NOT what you are used to getting!
